Improving Outcomes for an Aging Population: Alzheimer's Treatment in Long Term Care

Resources for Stage B Interventions/Action Plans

Below is a list of resources and activities available to long-term care facilities and clinicians, for implementation as part of Stage B. Please select the education to include in action plans based on what is most relevant to your needs, and the actions that you feel will be most helpful in achieving the goals identified. This is not a comprehensive list of resources or interventions available for Stage B; you may determine other education or action plan components that are more relevant based on your specific quality goals.

Examples of strategies for action plan include:

- Implementation of a follow-up screening protocol
- Implementation of a QoL re-assessment and review of resident's care plan
- Review/assessment of reasons for resident restraint use, and implementation of environmental changes as appropriate
- Development of transition of care plans for moving AD patients into the LTC setting
- Intended changes in the use of assessment tools and coordination of care communication
- Recognition/identification of barriers to medication adherence based on patient profiles created
- Establishment of cross-checks to protect against poor patient follow-up
